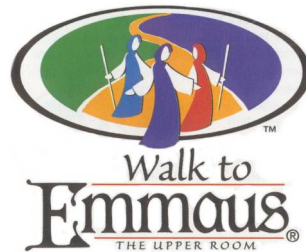
Walk to Emmaus

Collection baskets and specific information as to what goes into each pack will be provided in the Atrium starting August 26.

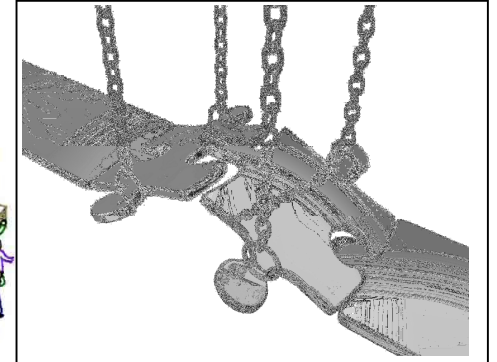
We will deliver our contribution to the regional collection center on September 27th.
